

SAINT OF THE WEEK:

St Gregory the Great (b.540) Feastday: Thursday 3rd September

Born in 540 he is called the apostle of the English. He entered the civil service but in 573 he sold his enormous properties, founding seven monasteries and giving generously to the poor. After entering St Andrew's Abbey, Pope Benedict I called him to become one of the seven deacons of Rome. He had hoped to lead some missionaries to bring the Gosepl to the Anglo-Saxons, having been impressed by some Anglo-Saxon slaves on sale in the Forum, but he was elected pope which he accepted reluctantly. Later he sent Augustine to England. His role in Roman Liturgy was considerable and he is associated with Gregorian Chant.
